### Upcoming events

Impacts to small, medium, and large hub airports

#### Unprecedented crowds expected in the U.S.

- 2026 FIFA World Cup
- 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games
- America's 250th anniversary

#### **Domestic events**

 Big sports or political events can draw substantial crowds, potentially overwhelming small and medium-hub airports "The Super Bowl, which is fantastic, has what, 120-130 million viewers? The World Cup has six billion. A World Cup is 104 Super Bowls in one month"

### Transportation incidents

- Paris Summer Olympics 2024 arson attack on rail system and infrastructure cable cuts
- Fort Lauderdale Airport 2018 shooting at baggage claim
- Gatwick Airport 2018 Unmanned aircraft system (UAS) sightings halted flights for 2 days during holiday travel
- Los Angeles International Airport 2013 airport shooting
- Bejing Summer Olympics 2008 bombings on two buses

### Federal preparation and support

#### **Administration actions**

- White House Tasks Forces (FIFA World Cup 2026, Salute to America 250, 2028 Summer Olympics)
- TSA technology and policy updates
  - Eliminated the "shoes off" policy; evaluating 3.4 oz liquid restriction
  - Request for Information (RFI) for turnkey checkpoint solutions; Broad Agency Announcement (BAA) for Seamless Identity Automation (SIA)
  - One stop security pilot for international travelers
- CBP Enhanced passenger processing and seamless border entry at certain airports

#### Potential federal funding?

#### Considerations for airports



- Is there enough public transportation to get to and from the airport?
- Has there been coordination among airports (reliever and hub), FAA, and FBOs on capacity?







#### Additional considerations

- Special events create economic and political pressure, but the same rules apply
  - Avoid preferential treatment
- Resources have a methodology for allocating scarce resources during events (e.g., aircraft parking if there is a surge in commercial and GA aircraft)
- Minimum standards consider updating to specifically address special events, including staffing needs and potential surge pricing

### Addressing UAS and AAM integration

#### **UAS** detection and mitigation

- Limited federal C-UAS authority to protect airports during an "emergency" (6 U.S.C. § 124n)
- Airports should consider criminal laws and federal requirements, including grant assurance obligations (federal C-UAS legal advisory, 2020)
- Leverage TSA vulnerability assessments; conduct table-top exercise

#### **Advanced Air Mobility**

- May see increased interest in AAM operating in and around the airport
- Consider issues related to vertiport construction (including electrification), security, and capacity of current technology
- Proposed pilot program



### Political events on airport property

#### Airport responsibilities

- Requests across the country to hold political rallies on airport property. Different approaches:
  - One rejected request due to potential costs
  - Another Fixed Base Operator (FBO) closed their facility to accommodate the event
- 1<sup>st</sup> Amendment protects political rallies under rights of free speech and peaceful assembly
  - Government may not discriminate against speech based on viewpoint
